## Fun Fox Scarf for Children



Fox scarves are very popular with children. Push the tail through the loop on the fox's nose and the fox sits snuggly round your neck. It's such an easy shape that knitters will be able to experiment and come up with their own ideas and variations.

**Use DK yarn** - rust and white would make a realistic looking fox or why not stripe the body in different shades to utilise odds and ends of yarn.

Needles - 4mm

**Eyes** embroidered with yarn are recommended for children and not the bead eyes shown.

Start at the tail end - Cast on 2 stitches in pale blue.

Knit in garter stitch increasing 1 stitch at every other end until you have 32 stitches. Break off pale blue and join dark blue.

Knit in garter stitch until piece measures 23cm from the tip of the tail.

Knit 2 stitches together 3 times, work across row to last 6 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together 3 times (26 stitches).

Work in K1, P1 ribbing for 17cm.

Knit garter stitch for 43cm.

Break off dark blue and join pale blue.

Knit 4 rows in garter stitch.

Knit 2 stitches together at the beginning of each row until you are left with 5 stitches.

Knit the 5 stitches in garter stitch for 10cm

Cast off.










Fold the tab over and stitch in place.



To make ears cast on 14 stitches. Knit 1 row. Knit 2 stitches together at the beginning of each row until 1 stitch remains. Cast off. Embroider two eyes.
